Sub: 8th Joint Note on Wage Revision Agreed With IBA – Waiver of Levy

On conclusion of Wage Negotiations with IBA on 11.11.2020 the long drawn demands of Bankers for wage revision and service conditions has substantially concluded with other Non- Financial and Ancillary issues pending for effective resolution. In this regard our Association has been receiving many calls and messages concerning imposition of Levy by many trade union bodies across the banking industry as per prevalent practice.

In the said matter, we are to inform that **AOUCB-WB has decided to waive the payment of Levy by the members** upon agreement of main Charter of Demands between UFBU and IBA.

Historically, Levy is collected by Trade Unions in different Sectors on varied occasions to raise funds from its Members to meet regular/ extraordinary expenses to ensure continuance of routine functional activities of an Organisation relating to members interests in place without financial hindrances/ constraints. Since the democratic election of present CEC in 2018, by the faith imposed by members amidst testing times, tiding over many challenges and obstacles, the members and Association has effectively faced many challenges and extraordinary circumstances in unison. Our Association has garnered many tokens of love and dedication from its members and one such opportunity has presented itself in form of collecting Levy to continue with our Organisational duties and responsibilities without any financial constraints.

In spite of foregoing compulsions, our Central Executive Committee in its virtual meeting decided after threadbare deliberations that AOUCB- WB shall not collect any Levy on Arrears receivables by the officers and to respect the democratic demand of the members. However, if any willing member subsequent to Agreement reached in XI Bipartite Settlement, wishes to contribute monetarily to Association in furtherance to its social agenda/orgnisational responsibilities may contribute any sum of money to our State Unit through their respective Zonal Units considering the obligation of our Association to pay the requisite share of amount to our Federation/ Confederation without putting extra financial load on exchequer of our Association.
